From the Principal

Monday and Tuesday of Week One were School Development Days, with staff undertaking professional learning. Day One focused on 'Boys in Education,' answering why boys are falling behind in primary school. In our own backyard, we have almost twice as many boys receiving 'D' or 'E' grades in English. They are also 10-20% more prevalent in recorded "Behaviours of Concern" (that statistic probably isn't a shock for those raising boys!) The angle we're taking is, if we can improve how we educate boys, then this will also benefit the girls, as it creates more on-task behaviours and allows teachers to focus more on assisting all class members.

The second day saw us get underway as a partnership school with 'Real Schools.' The focus of this partnership is to enhance our school culture through the implementation of restorative practices. My biggest takeaway from the two days is the buy-in and commitment I could sense from the school staff in their willingness to improve how we go about teaching and developing relationships. Shortly an invitation will go out to families to attend a 'Real Schools' information evening. In the interim, here is a link to the website for you to learn a little more. 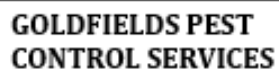
