NORTH KALGOORLIE PRIMARY SCHOOL - DRESS CODE

INTRODUCTION

The School Board of North Kalgoorlie Primary School has established a dress code for all students from Pre-Primary to Year 6 attending the school.

The School Council believes that a dress code will benefit all students and will:

- Foster and enhance student pride via the public image of the school;
- Assist in the building of school and team spirit;
- Ensure students are safely and adequately dressed for specific school activities;
- Encourage equity among students;
- Prepare students for workplaces who have dress and safety codes.

MODIFICATION TO THE DRESS CODE

Students, who for religious or health reasons, may wish to modify the School Dress Code are permitted to make an appointment with the Principal. Staff will be informed of any students granted a modification to the Dress Code.

ADVICE TO STUDENTS ON THE DRESS CODE

- Uniform shop is open Tuesdays before school and Thursday before and after school
- Students whose families may experience financial difficulties regarding the purchase of a uniform should contact our Administration to discuss the situation.

STUDENTS NOT FOLLOWING THE DRESS CODE

Students not following the Dress Code will receive:

- Counselling from a designated staff member on the benefits of a Dress Code.
- Assistance/support in obtaining suitable clothing, if necessary.
- A pass for an agreed length of time for dress modification

NB Students not following the Dress Code may be denied the opportunity to represent their school at official school activities, which include choir, sporting and social events.

NORTH KALGOORLIE DRESS CODE - SCHOOL UNIFORM

- Royal blue polo shirt with collar and school logo
- School micro-fibre and zip-up fleece jackets – all with school logo (with school logo only)
- Mid-thigh length shorts in royal blue only (no football shorts, brief shorts or board shorts), blue tracksuit bottoms, blue leggings, royal blue skorts or blue checkered dress
- A broad brimmed hat – “NO BROAD BRIMMED HAT - NO PLAY” POLICY OF SCHOOL.
- Recommended styles are the broad brimmed hat, available through uniform sales. (CANCER FOUNDATION recommendation for neck and ear protection.)
- Denim is not considered to be an appropriate material for uniforms.

SPORTS

- Faction polo shirt in appropriate colour may be worn for physical education and sport carnivals.
- Appropriate footwear is to be worn at all times (no thongs, crocs or Ugg boots)

The School Board recommends closed shoes as better protection is given.

GENERAL

- Watches and simple, small studs are the only acceptable jewellery to be worn.
- Oversized garments are inappropriate clothing for school.
- For health reasons (head-lice), all long hair is to be appropriately tied back.
- Cosmetics are not acceptable for school unless for medical reasons.
- Official school colours are royal blue shirt over royal blue pants.
