From the Principal

NAPLAN 2023 Results

As a team of teachers, we are analysing results and use this analysis, along with other collected information, to assess effectiveness of our teaching strategies and identify those who need further support. In this newsletter are results of Year 3 students. The faint lines on the graph is a comparison to similar schools. You can see there is a high percentage of students who require additional support in Numeracy (18% = 10 students) and Reading (21% = 14). We have compared this to our students who are on Individual Education Plans (i.e. Teachers and school providing additional support) and all but one are on a plan. When you look at the spread of results, it highlights the somewhat complex task for teachers to provide for a broad ability range within the one class, and that's our challenge we will tackle daily. Year 5 results will be in the next newsletter.

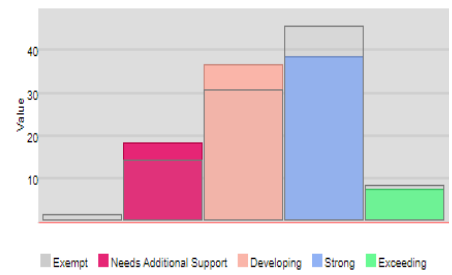
School Day Celebrations

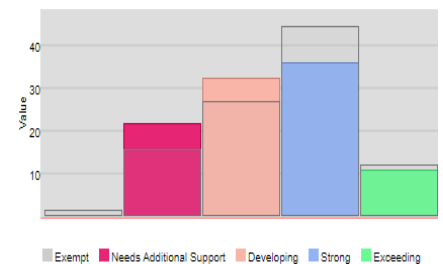

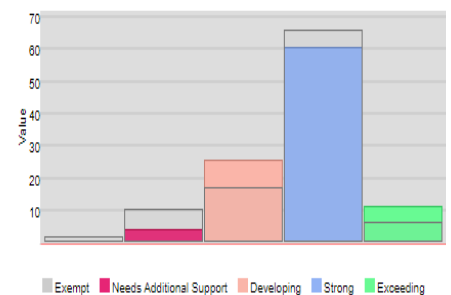

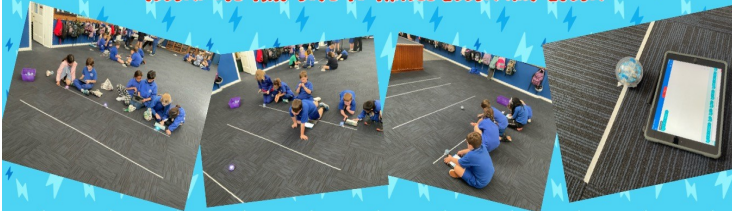
