






Following are some points to remember:

## From the Principal

### The Heat is On

"How do schools cope in the hot weather?" This is the burning question of the last few weeks. Here's what it looks like at your child's school for the extreme heat days. This information is from our 'Hot Weather Policy.'

Basically, what we do is: prepare students for the heat, provide alternative activities indoors and monitor and direct the level of activity outside

### **Student Preparation:**

Bring a water bottle every day, wear a hat outside or stay under shade, students instructed over PA and teachers to moderate activity to stay cool, students apply suncream to face and arms prior to recess

### **Recess & Lunch Measures**

Playing fields closed at lunch (and recess on very hot days), All eating under shade, Library and Tech lab open for activity, alternative activities in junior alcove, junior wet areas, hall and Addis St wet area (block play, board games, puzzles, drawing), fan on in undercover area.

Children are allowed outside but no heavy exertion games and mainly stay in shade

Pre-Primary classrooms are open for use, along with playing on the verandah Duty teachers observe level of activity and provide direction as required Physical Education

PE lesson in undercover area with large fan on Regular drinks break during lesson

Option of in-class program (e.g. dance) during extreme heat
