

In Term Swimming Lessons

For those children who have enrolled and paid for swimming lessons, they are commencing **Monday 26th May – Friday 6th June** (9 day series excluding 2nd June Public Holiday) and will be held at the Goldfields Oasis. Please see the timetable below for the times of their lessons. The bus will leave the school to travel to the pool 20 minutes before the commencement of each lesson.

- Students in **lessons 1 and 2** are to wear their bathers under their school uniform. If they are in **lessons 3 – 6** they can bring their bathers and get changed at school before the bus leaves.
- Please ensure your **child packs the following each day**: towel, goggles if desired, underwear, thongs to wear to the pool, and a sturdy bag to transport their dry clothes to the pool and then place their wet swimming gear into at the end of their lessons.
- **If your child has asthma** they will need to take their medication to the pool every day. Alternatively, if medication is not required whilst swimming, please provide the school with a written note stating that medication is not required whilst swimming before your child attends their first lesson.
- Classes in **lesson 2** will not be at school in time to purchase any recess and will therefore need to bring a **packed recess each day**. Classes in **lesson 3** will have an early recess break before attending swimming lessons and will therefore need to bring a **packed recess each day**.
- The Oasis has asked us to remind parents to please remain in seating areas during lessons and not disturb the teachers. If parents have any questions, please meet with the centre supervisor (red bib) after your child's lesson.

Please be aware children cannot attend swimming if payment hasn't been received prior to the commencement of lessons.

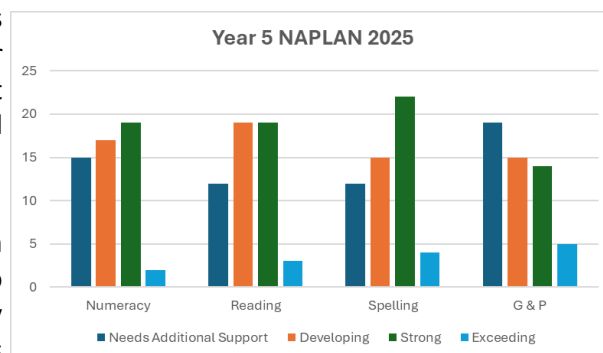
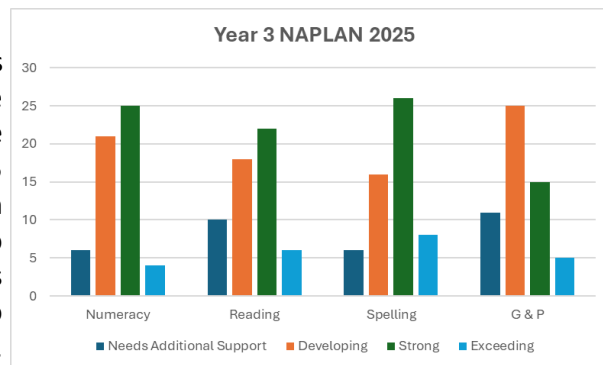


From the Principal

Recently we received some preliminary results from this year's Year 3 & 5 NAPLAN. The results largely align with information we collect as a school through our other assessment processes. The area of concern for us is the high number of students in Year 5 that need additional support. Currently, much of our intervention work is undertaken with our Year One and Two students, to provide support early on in their primary school years. Mrs Spooner runs the MiniLit program with Year One and Two students, supporting them with phonics, spelling and reading. Mrs Jones is targeting basic number facts through the Bonds Block program with the Year Two students. While we have Mrs Shaw, Mrs Borchet and Mrs Jones running the Reading Tutor program with our middle and upper years, the results show that we will need to add further support for individual and small group assistance, in the middle and upper primary years.

Week Six sees the start of our Cross Country training program (see details below). This is another opportunity for students to show their spirit of participation and join classmates for an early morning canter. One of the things I have liked about this program, is that students of all abilities have been willing to take part. Come join us. Parents are welcome to put on the runners and be a part of the session.

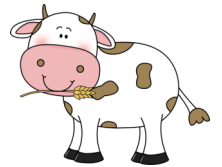
