# From the Principal



Last month we received the NAPLAN 2026 preliminary results. There are four categories of achievement: 'Needs Additional Support', 'Developing', 'Strong' & 'Exceeding.' The table below shows the results are significantly higher in Year 5 compared to Year 3. Varying levels of achievement amongst different cohorts is a common theme in our results. What it also highlights is the need for the Intervention and Extension programs previously mentioned in the newsletter. We have a very broad range of academic levels within every class and while teachers endeavour to cater for all students, the additional support provided by these programs is essential to the progress of students.

When all results are available, and they have been analysed by staff, we will present the findings and recommendations at a public School Board meeting next term.
