WA Student Assistance Payment

Included in this newsletter is information on how to access a \$150 payment per child for all Kindergarten - Year 6 students. One piece of information you require is your child's WA Student Number (WASN). If you can't locate this from your child's last semester report, then contact the school for assistance.

School Dental Health Service

The North Kalgoorlie facility has been closed for the last two years due to unavailability of personnel. The information I have received from WA School dental Health is they are still trying to fill the vacancy and it will remain closed until this occurs. Children from North Kalgoorlie can only access the South Kalgoorlie clinic for emergency cases, as they have no capacity for new patients. The only other option for families is through private dental practices. Some schools in the region have had a private mobile dental service attend the school. This doesn't replace the free dental service previously provided but is something our School Board can explore.

School Chaplain

Ms. Cynthia Payne has worked in the role of school chaplain at North Kal for a number of years. Cyndi works in this role on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays and is a vital cog in the school looking after the welfare of our children. If you think Cyndi can assist your child at any stage, then you can contact her via the front office.

Dear parent or carer,

Your State Government recognises the cost of living pressures Western Australian families are facing, as a result of higher interest rates and increased day-to-day costs.

Providing cost of living support to Western Australians is our number one priority.

We also believe that nobody in Western Australia should be left behind in their education. All students should have what they need for school – regardless of their financial situation.

That's why we are pleased to introduce a new initiative to help with cost of living pressures for families with school-aged children.

The new WA Student Assistance Payment will provide parents and carers with a \$250 payment for each secondary student, and \$150 for each primary school student or kindergartener.

You will need a valid WA Student Number (WASN) to be eligible for the payment. Please see attached important information on where to find your child's WASN.

The payments will be available through the ServiceWA app from the start of Term 2 (April 15), and we encourage you to use the coming weeks to set up your ServiceWA account and digital identity. Further information is available at <u>wa.gov.au/servicewaapp</u>.

Visit education.wa.edu.au/wasap for information on eligibility and how to claim.

We hope this initiative provides both relief to the family budget and an important investment in your child's education.

What's a WASN?


A WASN is the WA student number issued by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority (SCSA) at the time of enrolment.

It is an 8-digit number and is sometimes called a SCSA or student number. This number can be found on school reports, including previous NAPLAN results. It may also be on a secondary student's SmartRider.
