## From the Principal

Well the chrome on the caravan is polished and packed, routes on the map confirmed and a date set for departure. Deputy Principal, Lizzie Gooding is on leave for 12 months at the end of this term and hitting the road! Most of you are aware that Lizzie is the lynchpin of our school, planning the week ahead, dealing expertly with any crisis, and still having the headspace to show genuine interest and care in our students, their families and those who work here. Congratulations on a job well done (so far) Lizzie and I'm sure you'll keep the school community up to date with the "Gooding Family Lap of Oz".



It's our good fortune that Mrs. Caroline Kelly will be taking up the role of Deputy Principal for the ensuing 12 months. Caroline steps into the role with a deep understanding of the school's operations and direction, having taught here for over 10-years, as well as experiencing the school from a parental perspective, with her children Zoe and Josh being former students. I'm excited to work alongside Caroline and tap into her wealth of knowledge in effective teaching.

Well, the first bout of the winter bug has come with a vengeance, with one class having 17 out of 30 students absent on Friday. In total 86 were absent, many of them notified as being sick, with flu like symptoms. The WA Government has been advertising an extension to the free influenza vaccination. This is available through medical practitioners and many pharmacies. This includes a nasal spray free vaccine for 2-11 year olds. Attendance has dropped this term compared to Term One. It's expected children are absent during illness, and our concern for attendance is more about students regularly having a day or two off on most weeks.

As part of our 'Real Schools' implementation, many classes have embraced the use of "circles". The circles aren't just for Storytime or chats and are used to build trust, encourage participation and help students find their voice. Be it a Math lesson, Science investigation, or a discussion about playground friendships, circles create a space where everyone belongs and every voice matters. I've watched with interest as these circles have grown from awkward, finger twisting moments, or inappropriate interjection, into considered thought before responding. What a great small step into that occasion many people dread - public speaking.
